

Play Dough Recipe:

2 cups flour

2 cups warm water

1 cup salt

2 Tbsp veg oil

1 Tbsp cream of tartar (for good elasticity)

Mix all ingredients together and stir over low heat (get a parent to help with this part!). When it goes from mashed potatoes consistency to a big sticky clump, let it cool. After it's cool, knead until smooth. Optional: knead in drops of food coloring or Kool-Aid powder for fabulous colors!
